#### From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

I trust you are all well as we work our way through Lent towards the joyous message of the resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Earlier this week, the College Board supported the College Leadership Team's strategic decision to commence the planning and implementation of important works to take place from the middle of this year through to the end of year.

More details, including diagrams, sketches, and images will be provided in future editions of *Chev Need to Knows*. However, in summary the work will include, but not be limited to, areas of learning and general upgrades. Specifically,

- 1. **Teaching and Learning:** One current general learning classroom will be converted into a Virtual Reality Laboratory, and another into a contemporary learning classroom. These prototype spaces will help develop new ways of teaching and learning, as well as assist the teaching and assessment of capabilities such as critical thinking and collaboration.
- 2. General Upgrades to the College will further improve and add value to the already beautiful and natural appearance of the College. These include:
  - a. the appearance and safety of the CHED
  - b. beatification of areas in front of the John Fahey Centre and McGrath Hall
  - c. updating entrances to the College
  - d. new external perimeter fencing and signage.

Expenditure on these and other items will:

- allow for teaching and learning prototype spaces, required for contemporary learning, to be planned for in the Building Master Plan
- provide an uplift to the appearance of the College, most notably to the perimeter of the College
- allow the College to meet and maintain its obligations to provide a safe and secure environment.

I trust this is seen as exciting news as Chevalier College continues its next iteration of serving the needs of its students in the way of the MSC Charism.

#### Boom gates at Sacre Coeur Centre car park - now operational

The boom gates at the entrance to the Sacre Coeur Centre car park are now operational.

- Before 9.15am the boom gate will be closed/down and there is <u>no access</u> for parents/caregivers,
- 9.15am to 3.00pm the boom gate will be open/up and parents can access the car park/sick bay pickup,
- After 3.00pm the boom gate will be closed/down and there is <u>no access</u> for parents/caregivers.

During peak periods, please use Pick-up Points A or B to drop-off or collect your children.

For early morning music ensemble drop off or after school study or extracurricular pick up, it is recommended that you use the John Fahey Centre car park.

If your child/ren require special consideration to be dropped off or picked up in the Sacre Coeur Centre car park, please contact <u>our office</u> and provide your child's name, the reason for special consideration and supporting evidence (for example: medical report). Each case will be reviewed, and you will be contacted to advise if your request has been approved.
