Dear Parents and Carers,

Wherever you are, I trust you are well as we approach this June long weekend.

In the last week of this term, I will, for the third time, meet with all students and staff regarding '2024 Best Use of Time'. Further to this, there will be another Community Forum for Parents and Carers on Wednesday 21 June.

At this forum I will provide some modelling on a proposed 2024 Timetable. The modelling will adopt some considerations from the previous consultation with staff, students and parents dating back to March of this year. The modelling will include the following:

- 1. A 5-day school week we won't be having a 4-day week!!! However, on one day of the week the learning might look different to the standard 5 lesson day.
- 2. Reduce face-to-face delivery of core curriculum hours to NESA (NSW Education Standards Authority) indicative hours.
- 3. Increased options for Interest Electives in Years 7 to 10.
- 4. Possible early commencement of a few VET (Vocational Education and Training) subjects in Year 9.
- 5. Possible early commencement for a few HSC courses in Year 10.
- 6. Possible early completion for a few HSC courses in Year 11 HSC subjects.
- 7. Possible dual credentialing of a Diploma of Commerce with some HSC subjects.
- 8. Positive psychology and wellbeing lessons for students in Years 7 to 10.

I strongly encourage parents and carers to attend this evening. Click here to reserve your seat by Monday 19 June.

Please be aware we have **changed the time of the Community Forum** so that it now runs from **6.30pm to 7.45pm** in the **Sacre Coeur Centre**. This is based on feedback from key stakeholders.



Student presentation overview

Students will be broken into stages, and boys and girls will have different presentations appropriate for their age group. The following information has been provided by Collective Shout about the student presentations.

Navigating a s*xed up world: P*rn Culture, Consent and Respect

Young people are bombarded with hyper-se*ualised messages and images in media, advertising, and pop culture. They are increasingly socialised by social media and exposure to online po*nography. Drawing from global research and first-person accounts of young people, we will explore how exposure to se*ual imagery is contributing to a distorted view of bodies, relationships and se*uality. Students will critically evaluate how these messages harm their view of themselves, their bodies and relationships and negatively impact their physical, emotional and social development. Young people will have the opportunity to clarify their values, understand how they can enforce boundaries, resist harmful cultural forces, and form relationships built on mutual respect and empathy. They will also be presented with practical ways of engaging collectively in cultural change and social transformation for the benefit of everyone.

Topics:

- Objectification of women + se*ualisation of girls in media, advertising, and pop culture
- Harms of p*rnography + p*rn culture conveying harmful ideas about bodies, relationships, se*uality
- Impacts on body Image, mental health, wellbeing + resilience
- Predators, bots, 'se*tortion'
- Risks to young men of online 'influencers' such as Andrew Tate
- Loss of empathy through violence video games + popular memes de-sensitising young people to violence in real life
- Confronting se*ual harassment, s*xual assault + coercive control
- Understanding consent: why it matters: clarifying values/establishing boundaries
- Respectful relationships
- Personal and cultural change

Outcomes:

- Understand how social media + se*ualised media impacts body image, mental health + respectful relationships
- Understand how consent/boundaries are undermined by social pressures/p*rn culture
- Develop confidence to act according to values/boundaries
- Engage in social + cultural change

Presenters

Melinda Tankard Reist, Author, Speaker, Advocate



Melinda is an author, speaker, media commentator and advocate for young people. Author/editor of 7 books, she is best known for her work addressing s*xualisation, objectification, harms of p*rnography, s*xual exploitation, trafficking and violence against women. Melinda has appeared on ABC's Q&A and The Gruen Sessions and many other TV and radio programs. She is co-founder and movement director of the grassroots campaigning movement, Collective Shout: for a world free of s*xploitation. Melinda is an Ambassador for World Vision Australia, Compassion Australia, Hagar NZ and the youth mentoring body the Raise Foundation. She is also Senior Lecturer in the Centre for Culture and Ethics, Notre Dame University, Sydney and named in the Who's Who of Australian Women and the World Who's Who of Women.

Daniel Principe, Youth Advocate & Educator

Daniel is Collective Shout's youth advocate and educator. He has a background in PR, marketing, media, and as a health professional and advisor in the non-profit health sector. Daniel challenges toxic messages about masculinity in mainstream culture, which he critiques through a p*rn-critical lens. He helps young men to see how these cultural forces fuel distorted ideas and attitudes about bodies, relationships and s*xuality. Daniel works with young men to reimagine masculinity and embody a vision of manhood defined by virtue. He also hosts Collective Shout's podcast 'Reimagining Masculinity' and is a regular on TV and radio programs.
