


From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

I trust this finds you well as we look to the promise of regeneration that comes with the arrival of Spring.

As you are aware, extensive consultation with staff, students, and parents over a period of four months has resulted in the College Leadership developing 'Best Use of Time' for the 2024 school year. As part of that process, we recently provided all parents and carers with a 2-page summary about the 2024 Best Use of Time proposal, accompanied with a request for parents and carers to complete a survey. There were 240 responses to the survey out of an estimated 543 students in Years 9-12, 2024. This is a response rate of 44% per student and represents a response rate of approximately 52% per family. Most schools see a 10% survey response rate as the norm for most surveys. Data snapshots appear below:



Accompanying the snapshots above were more than 28 pages of comments. Those comments, along with other parent feedback over the last four months, combined with feedback from staff, students, and the College Board, have informed **a** decision about Best Use of Time.

With a commitment to maintaining, if not enhancing the MSC Ethos, as well as recognising the need to enhance self-regulated learning for students, Chevalier College will implement Best Use of Time as a one-year trial for the 2024 school year. With the support of the College Board, the implementation of Best Use of Time will be done in a careful and responsible manner. Furthermore, we will adhere to various advice and maintain an effective timeline for implementation. When implemented, the weekly timetable will be as follows:



- Tuesday to Friday is explicit 'teacher-directed face-to-face learning' conducted onsite at school with far fewer interruptions than is currently the case.
- 2. Monday will be a timetabled day of 'teacher facilitated flipped learning' (see draft timetable below) for all students in Years 7-12.
- 3. Not all Mondays will be 'teacher facilitated flipped learning'. Most whole college events and year-based activities/excursions will be held on Monday. It is anticipated between 20-25 Mondays will be 'teacher facilitated flipped learning' days. All teaching staff will be onsite each Monday to ensure the smooth implementation of Best Use of Time.
- 4. The location of 'teacher facilitated flipped learning' for a Year 9-12 student will be by mutual agreement between the College and the family. In deciding whether a Year 9-12 student can complete 'teacher facilitated flipped learning' at home, the College will consider:
 - a. the student's suitability as reflected by the attainment of the Chevalier College 'Self-Regulated, Flipped Learning Micro-credential' and their ability to maintain its ongoing requirements.
 - b. the emotional wellbeing and general capability of the student.
 - c. whether the student has a safe and clean learning environment at home.
 - d. whether permission has been given by their parent/carer. For 'teacher facilitated flipped learning' from home to be offered by the College, each family will be required to sign a disclaimer/agreement.

To ensure the ongoing readiness of staff, students, and parents for the implementation of Best Use of Time, a Best Use of Time (BUOT) Project Management Team has been established comprising of Deputy Principal - Barbara Santos, Director of Enterprise Services - Melissa McCoy, Sarah McKinnon, both Board Member and parent, and yours truly. The role of the project management team will be to oversee all necessary steps required for implementation to take place in January 2024.

In the first instance, the project management team has developed a timeline for the implementation of Best Use of Time. With reference to parents, carers, and students these include, but are not limited to the following:

- Developing clear and comprehensive policies that outline the expectations, responsibilities and guidelines for students, parents and staff participating in 'teacher facilitated flipped learning'.
- Developing a 'Flipped Learning Micro-credential' required for a student's eligibility in the program. The credential will contain the necessary skills and criteria for successful and safe flipped learning at school or at home. Within a clearly developed framework, it will be each student's responsibility to source the evidence required to attain the credential.
- Developing a 2024 calendar clarifying which 'Mondays' (not all) will be 'flipped learning' days.
- Continuing consultation with staff, students, and parents to gather their input and address any concerns related to the proposal. For example:
 - For students
 - clarify 'all things new' including requirements for the micro credential
 - clarify for each year group any changes to their timetable including early commencement of HSC, new interest electives, wellbeing subjects, timetabled assembly, etc.
 - For parents and carers
 - Develop a working group of parents to develop the next iteration of 'Parent FAQs' with answers to questions which emerged from the survey. Simone Wilson, Senior Manager of Marketing and Communications, will facilitate this process.
 - We also aim to engage a university 'action research partner' to monitor the progress of this initiative once implemented.

There may be a need to do more than the actions listed above; however, we move forward knowing that we will need to be responsive to ongoing advice and consultation as we learn more about the possibilities, opportunities, and challenges of implementing Best Use of Time.

For your information, I will speak to students about Best Use of Time at the upcoming assembly on Tuesday 22 August before another round of communication and consultation with staff, students and parents takes place in early September. By then, more will be known about the outcome of subject selections and interest electives, and how they inform a first draft of the timetable grid.

In conclusion, "thank you" for your patience to this point in time. There is much more work to do; however, the probability of Best Use of Time coming into effect from the start of 2024 is real and exciting.
