## myDESIGN Education

On another matter, it was great to have the myDesign Education team at the College on Wednesday and Thursday of this week. Richard Burton and Kirstene Ciappara adapted their school-based program to work with over 150 of our Year 10 students over a 2-day bootcamp. Using the unique SIM framework, students took an inside-out approach to reflect deeply on their SIM – their Strengths, Interest and Motivators. Students reflected that they are not only more informed leading into the Year 11 Subject Selection process but also feel a little more empowered to 'design their life'. We look forward to an ongoing relationship with the team from myDesign Education.







### **Collective Shout**

The previous day, the team from <u>Collective Shout</u> visited the College. **Collective Shout is a grassroots campaign movement against the objectification of women and the sexualisation of girls**. Since they launched in 2010, Collective Shout has achieved a huge number of significant wins: billboards objectifying women have been removed, inappropriate clothing for children withdrawn from sale, violent games banned, and other forms of sexualised advertising halted. Major corporations have joined the movement, pledging to reshape their practices for a world free of sexploitation!

Experts in their field, Melinda Tankard Reist and Daniel Principe hosted workshops for students throughout the day. Melinda worked with our girls to better identify the intense sexualisation and objectification of women and young girls that starts from a very early age. Melinda also clarified the definition of sexual harassment and identified behaviours which constitute it. Most specifically, Melinda strongly encouraged girls to speak with an adult to seek support in not putting up with it. Many of the girls reflected that they felt empowered by the messages from her workshop.



Daniel worked with our boys to identify the impacts of harmful messaging and stereotypes about masculinity. Through his workshops, Daniel helped our young men gain a little more understanding about how these cultural forces give them distorted ideas about their bodies, relationships and sexuality, and fuel inappropriate behaviours for some. Some of our young men felt more informed about acceptable behaviour and language, especially when directed towards girls.



Approximately 200 parents joined Melinda and Daniel for a presentation in the evening. Whilst the message was quite shocking, parents felt more informed about how to address the extreme challenge of supporting their child in to manage the pressures of social media and the messaging from mainstream media and other companies.



I have heard some staff speak very fondly of the messaging they heard when attending one of the student workshops. Whilst we pride ourselves at Chevalier in the way that we treat each other with respect, we acknowledge that in the growing years of teenagerhood, our students are sometimes less than perfect. The workshops and presentations from Collective Shout have brought to light that some behaviours within and outside our College that are simply unacceptable. Students were encouraged to speak to their Stage Coordinators if this raised any concerns for them. With greater knowledge for all of us after Collective Shout's visit, staff will continue to work with students to uphold respectful relationships and challenge behaviour which falls short of that.
