Fr. John Franzmann MSC has been a part of the Chevalier College story for many decades. He was in the role of Principal during the 1970's when he guided the College through the process of becoming coeducational. This was a significant initiative which saw Dominican Convent Moss Vale (an all-girls Catholic College) merge with Chev. The Dominican Convent campus became the Chevalier College Junior Campus (Years 7 and 8), and Chevalier became the Chevalier College Senior Campus (Years 9-12). Both campus united in 1984.

Fr Franzmann will be leaving Chevalier College in two weeks to move to our MSC Aged Care facility situated in Kensington, in Sydney. There he will be able to access greater care for his aged and health needs.

Fr Franzmann moved back to Chevalier about 25 years ago and this place has been his home during those years. He has been a teacher all his life as an MSC priest. He was Deputy Principal of our MSC College in Canberra – Daramalan, Principal at Chevalier College, Principal of St. John's College, Darwin among other appointments. He is renowned as an exceptional teacher of mathematics and until about five years ago he was still teaching and tutoring our top level students.

John is a quiet and reserved man; a man with immense wisdom and experience and he continues to share this with others. We will miss him here at the College, but we thank him deeply for all he has done in contributing to the life and development of a great school.

Summer Sport update
