

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What is STEP?

NOVA's School to Employment Pathways, that includes:

- ◆ NOVA STEP Job Club, an employment skills taster program, that supports students to learn about how to get ready for work, and what NOVA offers them post school
- ◆ Support with planning future pathways
- ◆ Taster Days with NOVA's Disability Employment and School Leaver Employment Support services
- ◆ Resume and Portfolio Development at NOVA's offices
- ◆ And for those interested in coming to NOVA post school, STEP also includes:



One of NOVA's school to employment success stories...

Jerome is 20 with Global Autism and an Intellectual Disability and is employed by Doors Plus. Since leaving NOVA he has completed a traineeship in Business Administration Traineeship.

When Jerome came to NOVA from school, Jerome's parents were anxious that the challenges associated with Jerome's difficulty learning and subsequent diagnosis of Autism would impact on him getting a good education and job after school.

While at school Jerome attended NOVA's STEP Job Club. Jerome's teachers invited NOVA to attend his post school planning meetings, where it was established that Jerome would benefit from a service with NOVA Transition. Jerome's parents chose NOVA Transition and this also gave them access to NOVA's Disability Employment Program.

NOVA Transition develops generic underpinning employability skills and vocational skills. The service involves participating in work experience placements with a variety of industries and employers to expand employment horizons and work out the best employment options.


One of Jerome's placements was performing administrative tasks for local company Doors Plus. Jerome enjoyed doing this work; it was a role that had routine and repetition and the quiet environment suited Jerome's sensitivity to sound.

NOVA staff approached Doors Plus explaining they were looking for a job opportunity for Jerome, and once we found Jerome a job he would be unable to continue work experience with Doors Plus. NOVA explained the service they would receive from NOVA and the benefits to Doors Plus of hiring Jerome.

The company did not want to lose Jerome, as the tasks he was performing were vital to their operations, and often left undone due to time constraints. Doors Plus hired Jerome in a traineeship position. NOVA arranged for full time worksite training and support to assist Jerome in learning his job and fit in to his new role as an employee. Additionally, NOVA became a resource for Doors Plus staff who had little disability experience. As Jerome grew in confidence and skills, NOVA staff gradually reduced support and increased Jerome's independence. As part of NOVA's service, Jerome still receives ongoing support from NOVA staff to ensure he performs to employer expectations.




Things you should know...

Staff receive ongoing training and development throughout their employment with NOVA and adhere to the National Standards for Disability Services.

NOVA's School to Employment Pathways Facilitators are chosen for their ability to work with young people and support them in their journey towards employment.



These staff have received training specific to NOVA's School to Employment Pathways Services. All NOVA staff undergo Working with Children Checks and Police Checks and are fully insured.


